<input type="checkbox"/>	Core Vaccine - DA2PPv (Distemper, Parvo, Influenza) <i>This core vaccination is a must for every dog. Canine distemper is considered a core vaccine. This means that, because canine distemper is a serious, highly contagious disease with a high death rate, all dogs should be protected. While commonly called canine distemper vaccination, DA2PPv is actually a combination of vaccines in one injection that will protect your pet from several serious diseases (Distemper, Parvo, and Influenza).</i>	\$15
<input type="checkbox"/>	Bordetella <i>The Bordetella vaccine is given to dogs that are frequently exposed to other dogs in boarding, daycare, dog parks, and training classes. The vaccine prevents kennel cough which is a highly contagious upper respiratory infection.</i>	\$15
<input type="checkbox"/>	DA2PP/Leptospirosis <i>Leptospirosis is a disease that is in the environment because it is carried in rats, wildlife, as well as domestic livestock. More cases are seen in late summer and fall and often after heavy rainfalls. Leptospira is known to exist in standing water, dampness, and mud. The disease can be passed along to humans. This combination vaccination is highly recommended for younger dogs but must be followed by booster vaccines to be effective.</i>	\$15
<input type="checkbox"/>	Rabies <i>California has seen cases of rabies in both domestic and wild animals and remains a rabies endemic state. All dogs are required by California law to have a rabies vaccine.</i>	\$15
<input type="checkbox"/>	Influenza <i>Canine influenza is a highly contagious virus that causes issues such as respiratory infections. Dogs who are exposed to other dogs in boarding, daycare, dog parks, and training classes should receive this vaccine. This vaccine must be followed by a booster at 2 weeks to be effective.</i>	\$15
<input type="checkbox"/>	Dewormer Treatment <i>Roundworms and tapeworms are common and can cause gastrointestinal problems. Dogs should receive deworming treatments as part of general wellness.</i>	\$20
<input type="checkbox"/>	Heartworm - Test Only <i>Heartworm disease is transmitted via mosquitos. All dogs not on heartworm prevention are susceptible and must be tested prior to starting prevention medication. The American Heartworm Society recommends that all dogs be placed on year round heartworm prevention.</i>	\$20
<input type="checkbox"/>	Heartworm - Prevention	One (1) Month - Single Dose, based on weight: \$8-12 Six (6) Month Supply, based on weight: \$40-60
<input type="checkbox"/>	Flea Prevention <i>Monthly flea prevention is critical to prevent infestations and minimize disease and/or skin conditions caused by the common flea.</i>	One (1) Month - Single Dose, based on weight: \$10-18 Six (6) Month Supply, based on weight: \$50-80
